## **Rottweiler Rescue Group Files for Incorporation**

WINCHESTER, NH – The Rottweiler Connection, Inc. has announced filing for incorporation in New Hampshire as a non-profit Rottweiler Rescue organization in New England, with the intent to secure United States tax-exempt status as a 501(c)(3) organization. Headquartered in Winchester, The Rottweiler Connection seeks to responsibly place rottweilers in good family situations through evaluations, education and adoptions.

The Rottweiler Connection was founded by dedicated rottweilers owners with dozens of years' experience with owning, training and showing the breed, as well as public education and animal rescue. The organization is completely volunteer-based and plans to generate adoptions through its web site.

Rottweilers accepted into the program will undergo a thorough temperament evaluation and reside with area foster families until a permanent home can be found. While in foster care, the animal will be spayed/neutered, and receive all veterinary care, thanks to assistance of local veterinarians. Dogs with an unprovoked bite incident will not be rehomed.

Adoptors will be required to provide references, demonstrate responsible dog ownership, and be visited by a volunteer at their home. Training and educational assistance will be provided for the life of the dog after it is adopted.

Members of The Rottweiler Connection have assisted in writing several breed-based and training publications and are eager to share this knowledge with other dog owners. Additionally, the organization has a wide variety of resources for behavioral modification, nutrition, training and general dog ownership. The group's president Dale Green has been featured in the *Boston Globe*, *The Boston Herald*, and several internet-based publications discussing rottweilers rescue and temperament evaluations.

The Rottweiler Connection, which operates primarily in New Hampshire and Massachusetts, will extend its services to other locations provided there are volunteers available to assist. The organization is continually seeking volunteers and foster families. Volunteers do not need to have any experience other than a love for dogs and a desire to learn.
